Marg's Tips and Hints

An exercise project from John Shaw.

Take 6 images on the same spot at different times of the year.

January: Snow and Ice.

March: Snow, maybe some brown spots.

May: Green grasses, fresh green leaves.

July: Lush green grasses and leaves.

September: Grasses that have turned to a gold colour.

November: Frost around water and trees.

He also gave an example of 4 images in a forest, which he shot through the trees.

He marked the spot where he shot them.

Spring: Dead leaves on the ground.

Summer: Lush growth on smaller trees.

Fall: Coloured leaves.

Winter: Snow.
