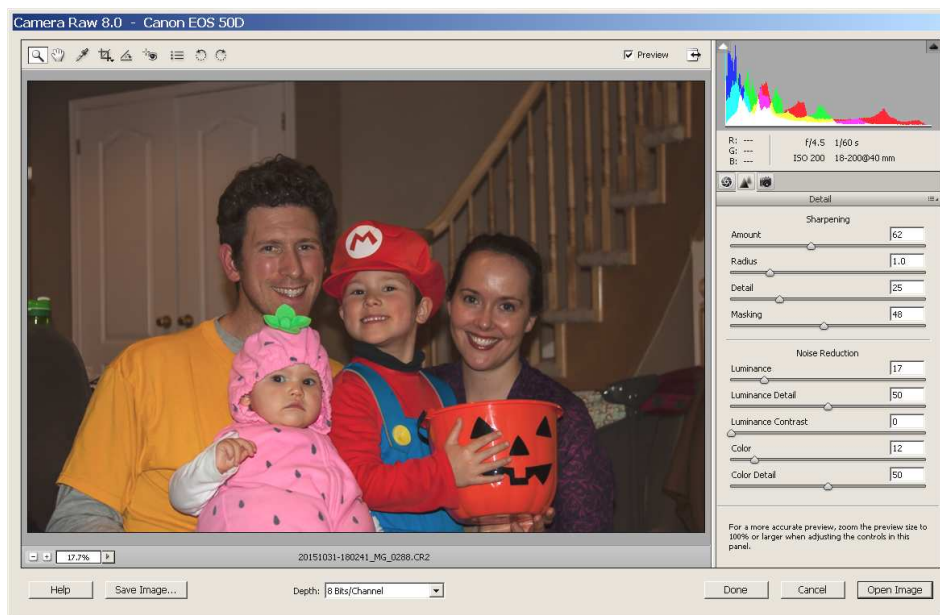

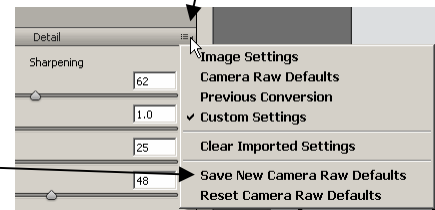
How to Change Camera RAW Defaults

If you shoot images in Camera RAW format you probably have some “usual things” you like to do – for me it is always setting Clarity, Vibrance, Sharpening and Noise Reduction. If you are constantly fiddling with these or other settings you can change the Camera Raw defaults by doing the following.

Open up a preferably new Camera Raw image and go thru the sliders and tabs and set the amounts to your usual range. Only set the ones that apply generally and DO NOT set sliders that are specific to the image you have opened – such as exposure. Once you have tweaked the settings do the following.



On the right side of the dialogue box, there is an odd little ICON that has three dot/line symbols and an arrow indication. Do a left mouse click on it and then select the Save New Camera Defaults.



The settings you have selected will now be automatically applied every time you open an image using Camera Raw. You can change or reset the defaults at any time.

Hint: This little option area exists in many Photoshop dialogues and opens up a number of interesting and useful options. Give it a poke to see what is available.
